Shaun never wanted to draw disability income, but I went to court with him, explained his situation and he was placed on disability. He immediately began trying to further his education in order to get off disability. His grandmother was his supporter, but after her death, he was basically on his own and has

have watched him in many ups and downs but have never seen anything keep him down for long. It: took some time, but he finally earned his college degree. Then the struggle began to find a job and that continues for him! During all this time, he has been an advocate for helmets for children to help avoid head injuries and for employers to hire the "disabled". Shaun will be pleased to explain all the speeches ine has made and the places he has visited trying to get people to listen.

Shaun knows he has problems, but I have never seen anyone who works as hard as he does to overcome those problems and he self-sufficient. If not for the injury at an early age, I truly believe he could be whatever he desires, even President of our United States.
