World Day of Remembrance and Hope for Road Traffic Victims

On 16 November 2003 - the third Sunday in November

'Remember Me' 10th Anniversary of Special Day to Remember Road Victims

Commemorated for the first time as World Day of Remembrance and Hope this November, this special day was initiated by RoadPeace and observed for the past 10 years in Britain and Europe as the day on which all those killed and injured in road crashes are remembered, together with their families and all others affected or involved in the aftermath.

Acts of remembrance and special services in places of worship will be held throughout the UK, in many other European countries and continents. Schools have been asked to remember road victims during lessons or assemblies in the week leading up to Remembrance Day and to highlight the risks from road danger.

Road death and injury a Global Disaster

Road crashes are *the* leading cause of violent deaths and injuries worldwide and World Day of Remembrance is drawing attention to the scale – 1.2 million killed and 30 million injured annually at present, and these figures are predicted to grow.

Need to remember

Road death and injury are not treated as seriously as other disasters, nor are road victims treated with the same respect and compassion as other victims of violence.

RoadPeace will remind victims on Remembrance Day of the other opportunities for public recognition and paying tributes to loved ones, offered to them by RoadPeace: * The internet memorial site, which was launched on Remembrance Day last year

- * Tree planting in the RoadPeace Wood, part of the National Memorial Arboretum

 * The 'Remember Me' roadside memorial plague, which was launched on 3
- * The 'Remember Me' roadside memorial plaque, which was launched on 31 August and will be publicised further and the campaign extended on 16 November.

Brigitte Chaudhry, National Secretary, said:

"We welcome the growing support for this Road Victim Remembrance Day, which has an important role to play in highlighting personal and communal impact and loss. The RoadPeace Wood, Internet Memorial Site and the 'Remember Me' Roadside memorial campaign offer an additional opportunity for commemoration in a personal and individual way.

The red flower on the 'Remember Me' sign symbolises love and loss, a fitting symbol for the lives lost on the road - prematurely, suddenly and violently."
